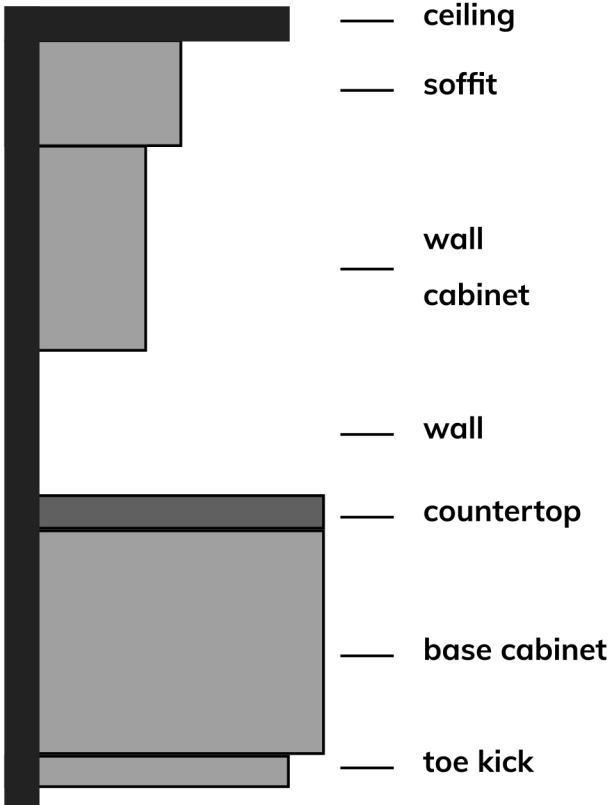

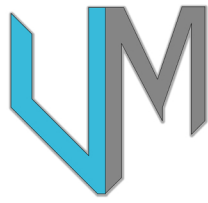

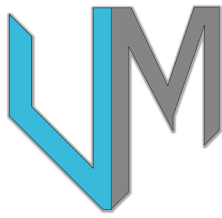


STEP 1: DRAW AND MEASURE YOUR KITCHEN'S WALL AND OBSTACLES

- Use a pencil and the attached graph paper to design your new kitchen.
- Pick a corner to start. Then measure the full length of the wall.
- Continue around the whole room. When record the measurements give a name to the wall you are measure.
Example: Wall A: 168", Wall B: 144'
- Locate and measure obstacles such as electrical outlets, vents, pipes, radiators, etc. Example: Electrical outlet 32" from wall C, 20" off the

STEP 2: WINDOWS, DOORS and APPLIANCES

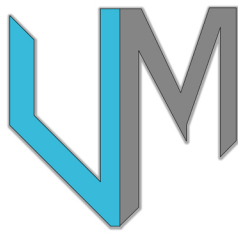
- Locate and measure windows, doors and room openings.

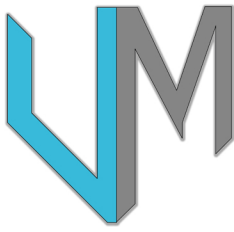
APPLIANCES
